#### 5. Student Support and Progression

5.1 Contribution of IQAC in enhancing awareness about Student Support Services

IQAC plays an important role in providing necessary assistance to students to acquire meaningful experiences for learning in the campus. Various initiatives have been suggested to enhance awareness of the students about various support services available for students-

- Student members of IQAC interact with the Student Council members and provide information to the students on the various support services, in addition to the information provided by the Head of Institution.
- The college published updated prospectus at the beginning of every academic year. It contains the information like vision and mission of the institute, list of available courses, eligibility criteria, list of main and optional subjects, subject combinations, fee structure, list of required documents, different scholarships and freeship available, information about library, hostel, prizes and awards, facilities available in the campus, list of departments and names of the faculty and non teaching staff.
- **Teacher guardian scheme** is implemented by the appointing special teacher guardian other than class-teacher.
- Social performance of students is improved through various activities conducted by NSS, Yuvati Sabha, Student Welfare Committee, Target Group, Students council etc.
- For the progression of students to higher education and gainful employment career counseling and placement cell organized various activities.
- Special guidance to advance learners is provided for their academic progression.
- IQAC also monitors proper functioning of women grievance cell, student feedback. Efforts are taken for development of research attitude through participation of students in "Avishkar". Holistic development and progression has been cultured through Morning Prayer and celebration of various activities like "Shardotsav", birth and death anniversaries of historical personalities and scientists.

#### 5.2 Efforts made by the institution for tracking the progression

The Institution has the following process for tracking the learner's progression to higher level of education through creating awareness regarding Training, Admission, Placement and Resolution to Personal problems.

- Institution looks after the overall progression of students.
- Heads of the department and officials meet occasionally to discuss on the academic progress of students.
- For academic advancement special efforts are taken for advance learners.
- The college council meets once in a semester to discuss various matters on the college particularly on student progression.



#### 1. The context:

The Principal and Members of the Library Committee came out with an excellent stimulus to activate Reading-Writing skills among students.

#### 2. The Practice:

In modern era, Students don't have time for reading books as they are engaged in watching television and Internet. The members of the library committee and language experts in our institution provide freedom to students to select a book of their choice which include mainly life sketches of eminent personalities, autobiographies and literature etc. Students enrol in the book review competition at their own will. Systematic and planned book issuing is monitored. Perceptions of individual readers of each book are submitted in the Library, which is examined by expert committee. The winners are appreciated and given prize in Prize Distribution Ceremony. All these helps to nurture and enhance reading as well as summarizing abilities.

#### 3. Evidence of Success:
